

T-Mobile will have the first Cellular lease on the Water Tower

In November CRRWC and T-Mobile entered into an agreement to lease space on the Water Tower. The water tower was designed to handle the load of up to 5 cellular companies in the hope to generate more revenue and to potentially lower costs to our members. The new lease is a 50% increase from the old lease and will continue to increase every 5 years. Although this one lease will not have an immediate impact on the rates, as we add more leases to the Water Tower they will bring us closer to requesting a rate case through the PUC.
